- Castles that are hundreds of years old

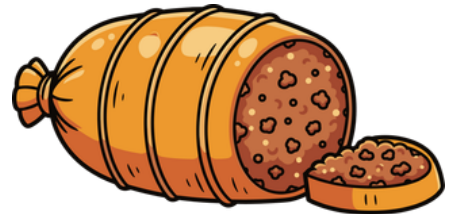


Haggis

Haggis is a traditional Scottish food that people often eat on special days like Burns Night.

It is made by mixing together:

- Meat
- Oats
- Spices



All the ingredients are cooked together to make a warm, filling meal. Some people think haggis sounds strange at first, but many say it tastes peppery and delicious.

The Saltire

The Scottish flag is called the Saltire (also known as St. Andrew's Cross). It has a white cross that goes across the flag in an X shape, on a blue background. The white cross is there to remember Saint Andrew, the patron saint of Scotland. A patron saint is someone special who looks after a country.

People fly the Scottish flag on:

- Special days like Burns Night
- Sporting events
- Celebrations and festivals



Bagpipes

A bagpipe is a traditional Scottish musical instrument that makes a loud, proud sound. It looks a bit unusual and is easy to spot!

A bagpipe has:

- A bag that is filled with air
- Pipes sticking out of the bag
- A mouthpiece that the player blows into



To play the bagpipe, the musician blows air into the bag and then gently squeezes it with their arm. This pushes the air through the pipes, making music. Because the air keeps flowing, the sound can go on for a long time without stopping.

Kilt

A kilt is a traditional piece of Scottish clothing. It looks a bit like a skirt, but it is worn by boys and men in Scotland for special occasions.

Kilts are made from wool and have tartan patterns, which are colourful lines that cross over each other. Different tartan patterns can show where a family comes from in Scotland.



A kilt is wrapped around the waist and usually worn with:

- A shirt
- Long socks
- Special shoes

Robert Burns

Robert Burns was a famous Scottish poet who lived a long time ago, in the 1700s. A poet is someone who writes poems and songs.

Robert Burns loved to write about:

- Nature, like fields, rivers, and animals
- Friendship and family
- Everyday life in Scotland



He is most famous for a poem called “Auld Lang Syne,” which people often sing at New Year. People celebrate his birthday every year on January 25th, which is called Burns Night



Loch Ness

Loch Ness is a very big, deep lake in Scotland. In Scotland, lakes are called lochs. Loch Ness is famous all around the world!

Many people know Loch Ness because of a legend about a friendly monster called the Loch Ness Monster, or “Nessie.” Some people believe Nessie lives in the loch, but no one has ever found clear proof. It is a fun mystery that people love to talk about.



The Thistle

The thistle is a spiky purple flower that is a symbol of Scotland. A symbol is something that represents a country, like a flag or a special animal.

People think the thistle became Scotland’s symbol a long time ago when it helped protect the country. The story goes that enemies were sneaking into a Scottish castle, and one of them stepped on a thistle. The thistle hurt his foot and woke the guards, helping to save the castle!

The thistle is prickly on the outside but beautiful on the inside, which makes it a great symbol for Scotland. You can see it in Scottish badges, coins, and decorations, and it reminds people of Scotland’s history and pride.



Tartan

Tartan is a pattern made of colorful stripes that crisscross each other. It looks like a checkered design. In Scotland, different tartans are used by different families or clans, like a family’s special pattern. People often wear tartan on kilts, scarves, and clothes for celebrations
